

Introduction

You have been studying the United States and the many responsibilities involved with the government. You have learned that one group is not able to organize the entire nation. Our nation is divided into 3 levels of government including national, state, and local government. United States government is also divided into three branches: executive, legislative, judicial. Several government officials will be visiting your school from each level of government and each branch of government as a final activity in the unit. Each student will write a logical question for each of the officials about their job and the responsibilities involved. You need to determine which level of government in which each person serves (national, state, or local). You will also need to determine the branch of government (executive, legislative, judicial) in which each person serves. Then you will write a question to ask the official about their job and responsibilities involved with the job.

The Task

Your task will be visiting several websites in order to determine the branch of government the official is working in and the level of government the official works in. You will need to take notes and complete the fact sheet in order to formulate your question. The teacher will select one of your questions for you to ask one of the visiting officials.

The Process

To accomplish the task, you should following the following steps and visit the links included. You will record information on your fact sheet about each government official.

- 1. You and a partner will need to visit the White House website and review the 3 branches of government and the 3 levels of government.
- 2. You will review <u>Georgia Government</u> and <u>Georgia General Assembly</u> websites for information about the 3 branches of government.
- 3. You will find and record information on the fact sheet about Lynn Westmoreland and about Lynn Westmoreland's career.
- 4. You will find and record information on the fact sheet about Lynn Smith.
- 5. You will find and record information on the fact sheet about Keith Brady.
- 6. You will find and record information on the fact sheet about Seay VanPatten Poulakos for <u>Coweta County</u> and the <u>Georgia Court System</u>.
