The website does not maintain record of student performance. It only maintains record of login information for membership purposes. The design also adds to the easiness to navigate the website. Colors are appropriate as well. Feedback and difficulty of instruction do not apply to the website.

Users can print information from the website if they choose to such as institution requirements and testing information. Documents are easy to read and accessible.
