Scenario 1: Carl has speech and motor disabilities. He has difficulty with his fine motor skills, making writing almost impossible. In addition, Carl's speech disability impedes communication with his teachers and other classmates.

This assistive technology tool is called EZ Keys. It is designed for users with a third grade reading level and above who have trouble with writing and communicating. This product can help the user type a letter; engage in conversation or serf the web. EZ Keys can be accessed through a variety of modes – standard keyboard, expanded keyboard, joystick since Carl has trouble with his fine motor skills. When Carl begins to type a word, EZ keys displays a table of six most frequently used words that begin with those letters, he would have to select a word from the display and EZ Key instantly types in the word. Additionally, EZ Keys can store thousands of phrases and sentences and group them according to subject, i.e. family, school, friends etc. This would allow Carl to retrieve this information and use for conversations.

Scenario 2: Shawna has very limited vision. She is unable to see standard size letters and words.

SuperNova, the second website listed above offers students with low vision magnification, speech and Braille output. It talks as you type announcing words or characters so you can check what you write. Additionally, user can manage the colors of the text so that one is able to see text easier.

Scenario 3: Serena's primary language is Spanish, and she is struggling with the readings from the assigned textbook for your class. Realizing that Serena needs audiovisual enriched materials to supplement the textbook, you locate several technology related resources.
