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Georgia Career Information System



A tool which can help students navigate their high school programs of study and develop a great map for directing them as they transition from secondary to post-secondary educational settings or as they enter the world of work.

One of my favorite Internet sites that I use is Georgia Career Information System. Schools must pay a small fee to use the site, but the money is well spent because students get the opportunity to explore not only careers, but virtually everything associated with those careers from a general overview to what schools in Georgia (and the US) offer programs of study that would prepare students for the occupation. Students may complete a series of personal career interest inventories. They can complete reality checks that help them understand how much money they will need to earn to have the lifestyle to which they aspire.

I work with special population students (at-risk) as an intervention services coordinator. Using this site allows me to get these students to think about their post-secondary options and potential career pathways. Students can explore every career imaginable, take career assessments, and create an online portfolio to store their work.

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
